Career Experience	Career experiences:  Demonstrate your goals and career related experience through your internships and employment outside of class. Community Involvement	Volunteerism:  Demonstrate your commitment to social responsibility by performing community service in a surrounding community. Leadership Portfolio	Showcase what you have learned:  Students learn a lot about leadership and themselves during their time in the ELP.
